As per the guidelines provided by New York State Department of Education Bureau of Proprietary School Supervision, no more than 5 curricula will be submitted at a time. There will be a maximum of 6 curriculum submissions over a 12 month period. This will provide for 30 submissions (6 submissions/year * 5 curriculum per submission) over a 60 month (12 months * 5 years) period. This would be a total of 150 (30 x 5) curricula.
